

These notes have been updated on 20 November 2023 following HMC Heads Webinar.

Important: It has come to our attention that vapes are now being used to transport and pass on drugs. When confiscating a vape check what the canister holds.

Where do you stand on vape detectors?

- Cost is a barrier to use; cheapest seem to be £600 £700 +VAT and most are upwards of £2k for a single unit.
- They need wifi.
- When they go off you then need to look at CCTV camera footage, this takes a lot of time and resource.
- Schools have big campuses, you can't have them everywhere.
- Pupils move location to avoid detectors.

Suggestions:

- Most companies offer a 30 day free-trial which has helped inform decisions for some schools.
- Dummy vape detectors can work well.
- Portable not fixed vape detectors work best.
- Strong argument for putting them in areas where vaping problem is affecting others, e.g younger years not wanting to use toilets that older pupils are vaping in.
- Need a way for pupils impacted by the vaping of others to anonymously report the problem.
- Noise / alarm of some sort to trigger when detector goes off can be an added deterrent.
- Possibility of tying vaping alert into fire alarm panels, noise to be upon detection of vaping
- If regular vaping is taking place in toilets there was a suggestion to take the doors off the entrance to the toilets making the space more open and accessible, less likely to vape as it is no longer so private.
- Vapourless vapes now exist making vape detectors redundant.

Summary:

They are expensive, take up a lot of time and resource, they might soon become useless, and ultimately schools cannot solve the problem just with detectors. They can however, be useful as a deterrent.

Education of pupils

- All felt education was the best course of action to take, early intervention is key!
- Be factual not scaremongering vapes still have a part to play when it comes to smoking cessation
- Education should be for all not just those that have been caught
- All agreed it takes time and is difficult to crack

Suggestions:

- Education also as part of sanction, e.g sanction to include a 6 part course at school health centre or with school nurse.



- Education in assemblies, these work especially well if lead by pupils.
- Posters with relevant information and statistics to go up in areas where vaping is prevalent

Summary:

Education is key – do lots of it!

Education of parents

- All agreed that parents are key, they need to play their part.
- Schools need to help educate parents.
- Parents can fuel the problem if they condone vaping and view it as your problem in school.
- Parents can support school and their child if they are using vapes to quit smoking by accessing NHS approved nicotine replacement products such as patches, pouches or gum.

Suggestions:

- Pupils to lead assemblies for parents on vaping.
- Talks to parents and pupils in same day so that they can have joined up approach and can discuss messages heard.

Summary:

 Keeping parents educated on vaping and updated on trends is important to help prevention in your community

When / how do you sanction pupils?

- Sanction policies that were mentioned included; one being caught for the first-time vaping:
 - o 1 day suspension if caught vaping or in the company of someone who is vaping
 - Headmasters detention with letter home on 1st offence
 - 1 week detention
 - o 3 day suspension and 6 part session in health centre (education piece)

Suggestions:

- It was felt a good option to include education piece as part of the sanction.
- Sanction should be given to those in the company of anyone vaping.
- Upon being caught recommendation is to immediately drug test to see what type of vape was being used.
- Policies need to distinguish between what type of vape was being used any that had THC or any other banned substance would hold greater, more serious sanctions in line with drugs policy
- Spot and search policies to be updated to reflect vaping



- Part of the sanction could be for pupils to run assemblies on vaping or similar.

Summary:

- Make sure your policies are updated and have education as part of your sanction.
